We have a busy time ahead after Alice has been put to bed, so brace yourselves everyone.

We are still awaiting confirmation of our entry to the Lighthorne Drama Festival – we should hear at the start of February. In the meantime, we are proceeding assuming that we are in, so that if we get selected, we are not caught on the hop. This means that we are aiming to run two shows in the spring at the same time, as follows:

Out of Focus by Peter Gordon, directed by Graham Robson; 25th – 28th May Dance before Dying by Baz Stalinski and Kaylee Holt, directed by Kaylee; 8th, 9th, 10th or 11th June

As the productions are so close to each other, we will need two completely separate casts and crews. The intention is to run overlapping readings and auditions so that people can make an informed decision as to which one they would like to get involved in and the directors can collaborate on their casting.

- ~ read through Wednesday 10th February, 7.30pm ~ auditions Monday 22nd and Wednesday 24th February, 7.30pm

Graham will need 4 men and 5 women of varying ages.

Synopsis – The village hall has been overbooked. There's Brownies, badminton players and people with table tennis bats fighting for space with those rehearsing a panto and a man desperate to show his slide collection to anyone who will sit still long enough. Finally peace reigns as relationships blossom, friendships form and people learn what it is to be part of a community.
